What can be disposed of as organic waste?

Organic waste collection bins can be used to throw away these items:

- ✓ Paper organic waste collection bags/sacks
- ✓ Bread and baked goods
- ✓ Eggshells
- ✓ Fish scraps or bones – if necessary, wrap in kitchen roll, paper towel or newspaper (don't use glossy printed paper)
- ✓ Feathers
- ✓ Meat, animal products (sausage, gristle, bones, etc.) in normal household quantities – if necessary, wrap in kitchen roll, paper towel or newspaper (don't use glossy printed paper)
- ✓ Vegetable waste (potato peel, scraps from preparing food)
- ✓ Green wast
- ✓ Hair
- ✓ Hay, straw (in small quantities) – without faecal matter!
- ✓ Coffee grounds and filter papers
- ✓ Cheese scraps, including edible rind
- ✓ Dairy food waste like yoghurt, curd cheese and hard cheese
- ✓ Nutshells
- ✓ Fruit scraps and peel (also from tropical and citrus fruit)
- ✓ Salad scraps and waste
- ✓ Cut flowers
- ✓ Cut grass
- ✓ Food leftovers (raw, cooked, spoiled) in normal household quantities
- ✓ Tea bags and tea leaves
- ✓ Pot plants (without pot)

Do not use the bins for these items:

- ✗ Ash
- ✗ Plastic flower/plant pots (even if marked as 'certified biodegradable' or 'compostable')
- ✗ Animal faeces (e.g. dog poo)
- ✗ Wet wipes (cosmetic wipes or other cleansing wipes)
- ✗ Liquid kitchen waste (milk, juices, sauces, coffee/tea, etc.)
- ✗ Fat
- ✗ Gift ribbons
- ✗ Glass
- ✗ Rubber bands
- ✗ Scraps of wood, treated (impregnated, painted, varnished)
- ✗ Hygiene products (tampons, pads, cleansing wipes)
- ✗ Coffee pods made from plastic (even if marked as 'certified biodegradable' or 'compostable') or aluminium
- ✗ Sweepings
- ✗ Ceramic and porcelain
- ✗ Wax candle waste
- ✗ Pet litter and bird sand
- ✗ Carbon copy paper
- ✗ Scraps of leather
- ✗ Medicines
- ✗ Wooden furniture
- ✗ Paper, paperboard, paper towels, serviettes
- ✗ Plastic
- ✗ Plastic bags, carrier bags and shopping bags (even if marked as 'certified biodegradable' or 'compostable')
- ✗ Cleaning rags and cloths
- ✗ General waste
- ✗ Soot
- ✗ Sawdust
- ✗ Hazardous waste
- ✗ Chipboard panels
- ✗ Vacuum cleaner bags
- ✗ Curtains
- ✗ Rugs and carpets
- ✗ Textiles
- ✗ Dressing materials
- ✗ Packaging, e.g. made from plastic, aluminium, glass, metal, composite materials
- ✗ Cotton wadding, cotton buds
- ✗ Nappies
